MFL Curriculum Intent:

"Learning another language is not only learning different words for the same things but learning another way to think about things."

Pyland School is placed on the outskirts of a predominantly white British market town in Somerset. Thus, our intention is for our students to develop the essential skills that will support them to become open-minded, confident, creative and successful life-long language learners, embracing diversity and cultural differences by finding out more about the world around them. Our curriculum aligns with the whole school curriculum focus on knowledge acquisition and ambition. Learning a new language gives opportunities for a richer and more fulfilling life.

Our curriculum enables students to develop:

- Confident communication and language skills, speaking and listening to each other using the target language
- Accurate listening skills with an emphasis on listening for specific details as well as for overall gist.
- Core vocabulary that will provide a solid foundation for language learning at KS3 and beyond.
- Reading skills that mirror our whole school reading routines and allow students to engage with a range of texts in the target language.
- Knowledge of tenses and key grammar essentials to enable students to express themselves accurately through both spoken and written French.
- An understanding and appreciation of the wider French-speaking world and their cultural similarities and differences.

Students at Pyrland School will develop the essential language-learning skills of listening, reading, speaking and writing in French so that by the end of Key Stage 3, students will be confident in understanding and producing language in at least three different tenses, they will be able to express opinions in a variety of ways and will show understanding of a range of texts written for different purposes and situations. Students will build on their existing English language knowledge to revisit key grammatical principles and recognise similarities between English and French, learning to recognise differences between the two languages, why things are different and why it matters.

Our carefully planned curriculum journey enables students to develop key skills such as attention to detail, critical thinking, comparison, logic and personal communication which will support both future study and employment opportunities. The topics covered during KS3 will prepare students for their GCSE studies at KS4, which in turn, provide a solids foundation for further study at A Level. Students should feel confident about choosing GCSE French, knowing that they will develop a secure understanding of the French grammar, vocabulary and skills required for their next steps.

MFL Curriculum Implementation:

All lessons contain carefully designed tasks that will develop the receptive language learning skills of listening and reading as well as giving students confidence with the productive skills of speaking and writing. These skills will form the basis of all formative and summative assessments throughout the year. Students will listen to a range of spoken French at near-normal speed and respond to a range of questions. They will read a variety of written texts following our Pyrland School universal reading strategies and will communicate to others through spoken and written French. Embedded within lessons is the grammar that underpins all language learning and enable students to communicate effectively in French.

Key Stage 3

Each year group has one higher ability, followed by mixed ability classes. Students learn new content as well as revisiting core grammar, tenses and transferrable vocabulary that will act as a foundation for new language acquisition throughout their learning journey. In addition to ongoing formative assessment, we conduct a midtopic review within each module to respond to any gaps in knowledge or understanding. There is a formal, summative assessment at the end of each module that enables progress to be measured in all four language skills (listening, speaking, reading and writing/grammar) as each assessment will test both productive and receptive skills.

Students follow the Pearson Dynamo resources. They build on their existing English language knowledge to revisit key grammatical principles and recognise similarities between English and French, whilst learning to recognise differences between the two languages, why things are different and why it matters.

Key Stage 4

At KS4, students follow the new AQA GCSE French 2-year course. This involves studying 9 modules across the two years that tie in with 3 key themes:

- Theme 1 involves people and lifestyles
- Theme 2 involves popular culture
- Theme 3 involves communication and the world around us.

Many of the topics have previously been introduced to some extent during KS3, giving students a solid foundation from which they can begin their KS4 studies. Students will either be entered for the foundation tier or higher tier examinations.
