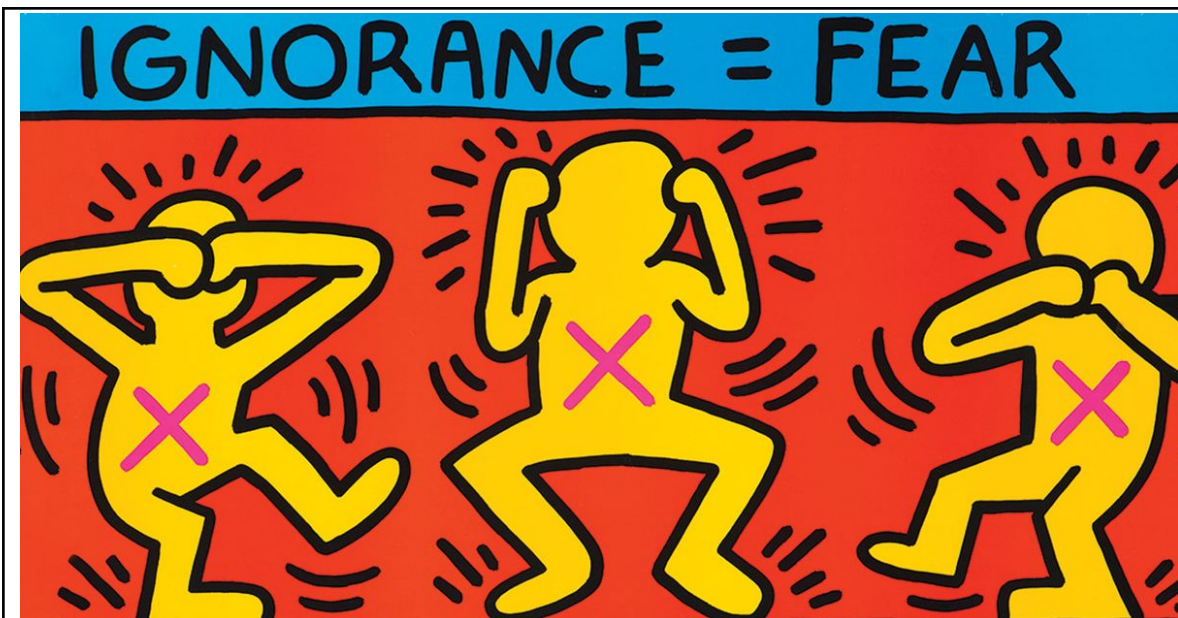
Build
